



Joliet Public Library received a 6.5 million dollar grant to cover a large portion of the funds needed for a major renovation of their building — a combination of a classic 1903 Daniel Burnham designed building and a 1960's vintage modernist building. With a lot of work to do, and a tight budget to get it done, they called on Engberg Anderson. We then helped them with a renovation that honors both the original Burnham aesthetic, refreshes the modernist addition, and bridges the gap celebrates the differences while creating one cohesive space. This dynamic linkage is easier for patrons and staff to navigate, makes more useful space in both the Burnham and 1960s areas, and respects the architectural identity of each.

In the renovation of the original space we restored elements of the building's frame, sourced stone from the same quarry used over 100 years ago in the original design to match existing materials, designed modern lighting that matched the existing gas light fixtures, and restored ceilings using cast molds of the original design. The minimalist aesthetic of the addition was honored and enlivened with clean, crisp forms, new finishes, and brighter lighting.

All of this is an evocative and functional platform for contemporary services that include an updated youth services department on the second floor focused on active learning, including a play structure modeled after the downtown business district; expanded teen services are also located on the second floor where they form a bridge between the youth area and the historic building and are already becoming a well-loved area of the library; and an advanced digital media lab in the basement including recording, filmmaking, and 3-D modeling equipment all of which supports an artist in residence space with studio space for rotating local artists. The theme of creation and interaction is embodied most visibly by a dedicated demonstration and maker's space on the first floor called the Joliet Room.

The result is a renovation that proves that you can both honor the history of a space, while also making it a landmark example of all that a modern library can be.

Statement of Philosophy

Buildings are about people. Architecture is a practical art rooted ultimately in human behavior and social sciences. It begins with the recognition that spaces shape behavior, and in the case of libraries, both the identity and potential of the individuals that comprise a community and that of the broader community itself are defined by public space. Individual and group aspirations for learning, knowledge, improvement, and community are embodied and expressed by the form and function of public buildings, their various spaces, and the connection of those spaces to the surrounding landscape. We embrace this as an opportunity and an obligation and believe our talents and experience are best used in concert with our clients and their patrons: The best way to design spaces for people is to actively engage those in a process of design that bends the creative and the pragmatic, in a framework that is interactive, collaborative, rigorous and rational.

Project Understanding of Project & Scope of Services

Quality library service across the district requires facilities that support a wide range of user interests and a changing array of specific uses. While we understand that this specific project is focused on the lower-level restrooms, each project needs to be thought of as part of a whole design and building. Decisions made now will be felt for years to come and must address the practical needs of today with an understanding of their long-term impact.

Process Matters

At Engberg Anderson, we embrace an interactive design model that actively involves the library in decision-making about their environment. To balance meaningful participation with efficient resource use, we have established a framework that systematically identifies project issues, builds a comprehensive understanding of the planning and design context, explores design concepts, and translates the preferred concept into a completed project through public bidding, construction, furniture installation, and post-occupancy review. This framework is reviewed and tailored with each client to meet the specific needs and requirements of the library. Our collaborative journey begins with the design process itself, guided by the following key components:

Drawing on our understanding of the project, we recommend a series of on-site workshops. These sessions will engage the library's management team, key staff, and trustees, as appropriate for each stage of the project. Through this collaborative framework, we will complete the following phases:

Pre-Design

The foundation of this project is built upon a thorough investigation of existing conditions, a comprehensive code review, and the creation of a detailed facility model. To ensure a robust framework, the team will request a complete list of items required for effective project planning. A detailed schedule, workplan, and draft agendas for each workshop will be developed. During the kick-off meeting, the design team will conduct a site verification tour to visually inspect all areas of work.

Existing Documents

Existing drawings, specifications, and maintenance manuals are essential for understanding the building. These resources offer invaluable behind-thescenes insights that are crucial for precise and effective design. During our review, we may also identify areas requiring further investigation, making these documents a critical starting point.



Model

We will use the existing drawings to construct a detailed model of the building. Since 2010, Engberg Anderson has relied exclusively on Building Information Modeling (BIM), which enhances our ability to explore and document design concepts. BIM technology creates a comprehensive project database, capturing detailed information about building components. This approach reduces errors, omissions, and RFIs, and ensures the final building aligns closely with the client's vision by facilitating clear communication among all stakeholders throughout the project life cycle.

EA uses Autodesk Revit as our primary BIM authoring application. We complement the use of Revit with a wide range of specialty applications to accomplish focused design and documentation tasks. The use of these applications leverages the value of the information model.

Code Review

The last step in the foundational process is a thorough code review of the building. Any renovation, especially restroom upgrades, requires an in-depth analysis of applicable codes, including:

- International Building Code (IBC)
- Plumbing
- Accessibility
- Fire protection
- Electrical
- Mechanical standards

For restroom renovations in Illinois, a complete plumbing count for the entire building is required. Understanding this aspect is essential for informed decisionmaking.

Design

The Design phase translates pre-design work into tangible, functional concepts. This stage includes three key workshops with your project team to foster a collaborative and comprehensive process. Our approach is to develop and explore design concepts through these workshops, utilizing hand sketches, drawings, and three-dimensional computer models. This ensures your team has multiple ways to visualize and understand the design as we make decisions together.

Workshop 1 & 2

Workshop 01 serves as the project kick-off, focusing on preliminary design and field verification. During this meeting, we will establish the project framework, review goals, the workplan, and schedule. The team will present mood boards and concept images to inspire discussion and imagination. Additionally, the A/E team will conduct a site visit to assess the building's condition and systems, providing a detailed understanding of the existing elements.

Insights and feedback from the kick-off will inform the agenda for **Workshop 02.** In this session, we will review design concepts, access, equipment, lighting, door hardware, and several finish options. The meeting will be documented, and we will begin preparing a set of documents for cost estimation.



Cost Estimates

A cost model will be prepared for review by the Library. Based on decisions made by Library stakeholders, we will organize a comprehensive cost model for the project scope, including a breakdown of work areas and project soft costs.

Our integrated estimating process is designed to support proactive financial stewardship, ensuring the project remains on budget from the outset. We will provide ongoing budget monitoring through estimates prepared at both the Design and Construction Document phases. Each update will include documented assumptions and value engineering suggestions to keep the project aligned with budgetary goals. Input from trusted subcontractor partners may also be sought to validate our numbers and provide insight into the current bidding climate.

Workshop 3

Workshop 03 will be the final design and estimate review. The design team will present a coordinated documentation package and an estimate of probable costs for review and approval before moving forward. This session will also include a detailed walkthrough of current finish selections and options that still require final decisions.

Construction Documents

The Construction Documents phase emphasizes coordination among the various specialty disciplines to produce a complete and cohesive set of bid-ready documents. This phase will include one workshop with your project team. Workshop 04 will be a final review of all the decisions, design, finishes and the construction documents. Here, the design team will present the full, coordinated documentation package and an estimate of probable costs for review and approval before proceeding to the bidding phase.

In parallel with our design efforts, we will engage in a thorough quality control review. This process ensures that all documents meet the highest standards of accuracy and integrity before they are finalized. We will discuss and recommend bidding requirements, contractor contracts, as well as all supplementary conditions.

The completed documents and an updated cost estimate will be sent to you for your review and approval.

Bidding

Engberg Anderson has an exceptional history in working with public agencies and a deep understanding of the public bid process. Our team will manage the public bidding process, ensuring a transparent and competitive selection of a qualified contractor. We will develop the final bid documents, conduct an on-site pre-bidding conference to allow contractors to understand the space and ask questions about the documents, and prepare any necessary bid addenda. We will then attend the public bid opening, create a tabulation of all qualified bidders, and prepare a recommendation for the Shorewood-Troy Public Library to select the lowest-responsible bidder.

Construction Administration

During this final phase, the design team will fully represent the Shorewood-Troy Public Library interests. We will begin with a pre-construction conference, manage all project progress documentation and review, and coordinate with the Library's Representative for all required decisions. Our responsibilities will include:

- Reviewing shop drawings and submittals.
- Participation in regularly scheduled job site meetings, including the participation
 of consultants at project milestones, as well as regular construction site field
 observation and documentation in the form of field reports and photography.
- Tracking project issues, questions, and requests for information (RFIs).
- Tracking the proposed changes to project scope and related costs as well as tracking project contingency.
- Issuing changes to the project documentation in the form of project memos or architect's supplemental instructions as appropriate.
- Issuance of construction change directives only with prior approval.
- Reviewing contractor applications for payment and change orders.
- Review of contractor's logs of open RFI, issued project changes, shop drawing review status, and contingency balance status.

- Conducting substantial completion inspection and issuing a certification of Substantial Completion and associated punch lists.
- Final inspection and review of completed punch lists.
- Coordinating warranty and maintenance documentation and staff training by appropriate subcontractors or manufacturers' representatives.
- Review of contractor's record drawings and specifications for final issuance before certification of final payment to the contractor.

Upon completion of the construction phase, it will be our responsibility to verify that the work put in place is complete and consistent with the construction documents and that all "punch list items" are completed. We will also verify that the contractor's "record" drawings and operations and maintenance manuals are complete and transmitted before the certification of final payment. Finally, we will prepare a final set of "as-designed" documents for the Library's records.



Sustainability
